Message from Simon Cosgrove, Accommodation Project Worker, Nightstop Communities Northwest:


Nightstop Communities Northwest (CIC) are looking for dedicated, compassionate volunteers who have a spare bedroom in their home to become **volunteer hosts** for single vulnerable young people in the community for Nightstop emergency accommodation service. All CIC's young people are fully risk assessed and police checked before being placed. The hosts in the Nightstop service provide a bed for the night for young people who may need it, in a moment of crisis. It prevents young people from sleeping rough, 'sofa surfing', or staying in unsuitable accommodation where they would be at risk of abuse. Our Blessed Lady of Fatima is touring families around Warrington. Our Lady wishes to visit every household, wherever invited. Placing her statue in a place of honour, may she receive the prayers and petitions of her children during one week, presenting them to her Divine Son Our Lord Jesus Christ. Every Sunday, the statue will come back to her Shrine (St Mary's Church) in Warrington, thence to accompany another family to their home at the end of Sunday Mass, and stay among them for a week. Holy Communion Reminder:

- To receive Holy Communion, one must be 1) a Roman Catholic 2) in state of grace (no grave sin unabsolved on one's conscience) and 3) have fasted for at least one hour.
- In the traditional Latin rite used at St Mary's, Holy Communion is received kneeling (if one can), and in any case on the tongue: thank you very much in advance.
- Please use the entire width of the Communion rail, from one wall of the church all the way to the opposite wall, avoiding any gaps. This will make distribution quicker. Thank you.

How to use the Communion plate: In the absence of an altar server, please hold the communion plate under your chin while kneeling at the Communion Rail. The purpose of the plate is to prevent the Sacred Host (or fragments of it) from falling accidentally to the floor. For that reason, please make sure the plate is close to your throat, avoiding any gap between your chin and the ciborium. Please hand the plate to the communicant on your left after you have received it, holding it by the handle at either end, so as not to touch the surface. Thank you.

- **Altar Server Training Days, Saturday 26 August & Saturday 30 September, 11:30am - 4pm.** Please contact Fr Mawdsley for a place on the training day. Finish about 4pm.

- **Latin classes: Fridays 1, 8 & 29 Sep, 1:10pm.** Holy Mass is not Bible study, but worship! Improve your worship of God by reading next Sunday's Gospel some days in advance, in a group, word by word, in sacred language—Latin. We study the Gospel outside of Holy Mass to know better what we are offering back to God in Holy Mass. Classes are suitable for absolute beginners.
