Confessions take place in the Confessional (glazed door to the left as you walk into the Nave)


30 minutes before our TWO Sunday Masses, and before EVERY Mass, EVERY day.

Safeguarding: Children, teenagers and vulnerable adults must be accompanied or supervised at all times within the Shrine. Chris Gehrke, a member of St Mary's congregation, is our registered Safeguarding Representative. Please report any concern to him (01925 630 127). Thank you for your awareness.

Holy Communion Reminder:

- To receive Holy Communion, one must be 1) a Roman Catholic 2) in state of grace (no grave sin unabsolved on one's conscience) and 3) have fasted for one hour at least.
- In the traditional Latin rite used at St Mary's, Holy Communion is received kneeling (if one can), and in any case on the tongue: thank you very much in advance.
- Lastly, would you please use the entire width of the Communion rail, that is, from one wall of the church all the way to the opposite wall, avoiding any gaps? This will make distribution quicker. Thank you.

Sunday 23rd October: Blessed are you who pray for vocations!

Every year, the Sunday following October 18th (when in 1988 our Fraternity was canonically established) members of the Confraternity of St Peter, our prayer network for priestly vocations are offered a blessing at the end of Mass. After the Last Gospel, they may either come and kneel at the communion rail, or remain at their pews and be blessed from a distance. The whole congregation is invited to pray together the following Prayer for Vocations:



O Lord Jesus, born to give testimony to the Truth, Thou who lovest unto the end those whom Thou hast chosen, kindly hear our prayers for our pastors.

Thou who knowest all things, knowest that they love Thee and can do all things in Thee who strengthenest them.

Sanctify them in Truth. Pour into them, we beseech Thee, the Spirit whom Thou didst give to Thy apostles, who would make them, in all things, like unto Thee.

Receive the homage of love which they offer up to Thee, who hast graciously received the threefold confession of Peter.

And so that a pure oblation may everywhere be offered without ceasing unto the Most Holy Trinity, graciously enrich their number and keep them in Thy love, who art one with the Father and the Holy Ghost, to whom be glory and honour forever. Amen.

In other countries where the Church is growing against all the odds – particularly in the explosive growth of the Faith behind the old Iron Curtain – the pastoral needs of the faithful are huge as they often do not have the material resources to support their priests, build and maintain their churches and chapels, and educate their children in the Faith. Fr de Malleray is concerned:

In ordinary circumstances it would be fitting for every Catholic to take a weekend off once a year to be with the Lord. In our times of dechristianisation it is more than fitting: it is vital. I give retreats every year for youth, for clergy and for the laity. Those were mostly located far from here at Douai Abbey in Berkshire. Last time 42 adults attended the weekend. I cancelled the booking at Douai Abbey for this coming Advent, assuming that there would be similar interest from people in the North West, to whom I wished to give an opportunity. Pantasaph is well known from Catholics in this part of England. It is a wonderful setting, beautiful, accessible and with a lovely chapel and grounds. Silence should not deter you, though you may not be used to it. Give it a try and you will hear the Voice of God. However, the local *Padre Pio Café* is available throughout the day if you want a chat – and a cuppa! The entire guest house is booked for us (up to 50 adults), but so far we have only six bookings... This is a real concern to me. Please speak with me if anything hinders you (cost, transportation, special diet) and we will find a solution! **All welcome: tell your friends, even though they may not attend at St Mary's.**
