If you are new to this beautiful place of worship, make sure you take the printed Sunday booklet with all the translations in English (you can take it home as well as this announcement sheet).

You may also borrow a copy of the small Mass books available in the Vestibule, putting it back before leaving. You are very welcome to meet with the clergy and community after Mass in the "Cloister" (corridor to your left down the Nave).

**Confessions take place in the Confessional (glazed door to the left as you walk into the Nave)**

**30 minutes before our TWO Sunday Masses, and before EVERY Mass, EVERY day.**

**Safeguarding:** Children, teenagers and vulnerable adults must be accompanied or supervised at all times within the Shrine. **Chris Gehrke, a member of St Mary's congregation, is our registered Safeguarding Representative.** Please report any concern to him (01925 630 127). Thank you for your awareness.

**Holy Communion Reminder:**

- To receive Holy Communion, one must be 1) a Roman Catholic 2) in state of grace (no grave sin unabsolved on one's conscience) and 3) have fasted for one hour at least.
- In the traditional Latin rite used at St Mary's, Holy Communion is received kneeling (if one can), and in any case on the tongue: thank you very much in advance.
- Lastly, would you please **use the entire width of the Communion rail**, that is, from one wall of the church all the way to the opposite wall, avoiding any gaps? This will make distribution quicker. Thank you.

**First Extraordinary Form Ordinations in England** (see *Catholic Herald* full article on our website)

New priests bring lasting joys for all, and graces from God. Even more so when they are ordained locally. After Fr Matthew Jolley ordained at St Mary's last year, Fr James Mawdsley might have been ordained at St Mary's as well, if all not been arranged already in Germany. We are very grateful to Archbishop Malcolm McMahon, our local Ordinary in Liverpool, for having agreed to ordain two of our deacons to the sacred priesthood. The ceremony will take place next year at St Mary's Shrine Church in Warrington, on Saturday, June 17<sup>th</sup> at 11am. It will be in the Extraordinary Form of the Roman rite. All are welcome. The first candidate is Deacon Alex Stewart, FSSP, from Wallasey, across the water from Liverpool. Born in 1974, Deacon Alex worked in Ireland in a tourism resort for several years and was a



committed surfer. He was admitted to our American seminary in September 2010. The second is Deacon Krzysztof Sanetra, FSSP, who was born in Poland in 1983. After gaining a master's degree in political science in Kraków, Deacon Krzysztof spent his last three years in the secular world in Ramsgate and London, and heard God's call. Let us pray for their last nine months of preparation.

**Sacraments at St Mary's:** The seven Sacraments are the seven greatest channels of grace in the world. By them we come into real contact with our Risen Lord Jesus Christ. Anyone is welcome to receive the Sacraments at St Mary's Shrine. To qualify for Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage, you only need to be booked in the relevant preparation programme with us; and to be happy to have the ceremony in the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite (that is, in Latin with printed and spoken English translations of the readings, and with some prayers directly in English for Baptism and Matrimony). For Catholics, Confession & Holy Communion are available daily. Holy Communion for the sick and Last Rites for the dying are available on request, including of course home and hospital visits. And as for Holy Orders, *Deus providebit...*
