Short Classes in Simple Latin for following the Mass and the Missal

Following some feedback, it seems the three most convenient times for a short and simple Latin class to help in following the Mass / the Missal would be perhaps Mondays at 7pm, or else Wednesdays at 1:10pm (after Mass), or Fridays at 1:10pm (after Mass). Please let us know what you think and we will announce times in next week's bulletin.

Holy Communion Reminder:

- To receive Holy Communion, one must be 1) a Roman Catholic 2) in state of grace (no grave sin unabsolved on one's conscience) and 3) have fasted for at least one hour.
- In the traditional Latin rite used at St Mary's, Holy Communion is received kneeling (if one can), and in any case on the tongue: thank you very much in advance.
- Please **use the entire width of the Communion rail**, from one wall of the church all the way to the opposite wall, avoiding any gaps. This will make distribution quicker. Thank you.
